Where are we now

The ECEC sector - services are approved under the National Quality Framework or licensed under the Children and Young People Act 2008:

- preschool for four-year-old children delivered by the **ACT Government**;
- preschool and other early childhood services delivered by **non-government schools**; and
- preschool and other early childhood services delivered by long day care, playschools and other services.

playschools and **education and care services** provide a full day of care and learning which supports the needs of children and families.

Overall, approximately 500 to 600 of the most vulnerable three-year-old children in the ACT miss out on the benefits of early childhood education and care services each year.



Relationships and sex education RSE

Age appropriate RSE integrated throughout the school years is a protective factor for longterm wellbeing.

Educating children about creating and maintaining healthy relationships throughout their schooling empowers them to make informed decisions about their relationships throughout adult life.

Early years policy and initiatives

The Education Directorate is developing a policy framework for fostering proactive collaborative relationships in early childhood education.

Council is also currently reviewing policy for relationships and sex education, and

ACT Minister Yvette Berry has outlined the government's commitment to a 'gender equality in schools' initiative:

Having an age-appropriate and whole-school approach to respectful relationships education will ensure that school communities promote gender equality, respect and embrace diversity... Creating a culture of gender equality in schools works to prevent family and domestic violence in our community.
